

SIMPLIFIED PRIVACY NOTICE OF "PERSONAL DATA SYSTEM OF THE CDMX KEY TOOL OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF MEXICO".

The Digital Agency for Public Innovation of Mexico City (ADIP), through the General Directorate of Digital Government, is responsible for the processing of personal data provided by users. This is protected under the **"PERSONAL DATA SYSTEM OF THE LLAVE CDMX TOOL OF THE MEXICO CITY GOVERNMENT"**.

Personal data collected will be used for purpose of allowing people who so wish, to generate a Llave CDMX Account to authenticate their identity through the digital channels offered by the Public Administration and the Alcaldías of Mexico City, to digitally manage procedures or services, and to obtain attention on the use of the Llave CDMX Account, via institutional email, user-service chat, telephone, social networks, or in person, by public servants assigned to the General Directorate of Digital Government, or through user-service chat, telephone or social networks, by LOCATEL operators, as well as through the following platforms: <https://actualizadatosllave.cdmx.gob.mx/> and <https://eliminacuentallave.cdmx.gob.mx/>.

The intended use of personal data collected is to validate information provided by the user, to preload their data into the digital channels offered by the Public Administration and the Alcaldías of Mexico City, to request procedures and services, and to receive attention on the use of the Llave CDMX Account and update a means of contact on the platform.

Personal data may be transferred to:

a) Centralized Public Administration of Mexico City: To preload the information linked to the Llave CDMX account of the holders of personal data and to authenticate a digital identity for the management of procedures and services offered through digital channels within the scope of that service.

b) Dependent government entities: for the study, planning and dispatch of matters within the purview established in the applicable legal and administrative ordinances.

f) Fiscal entities:

1. Superior Auditor of the Mexican Federation; for the exercise of its functions of supervision and control of compliance with the use of federal public resources.

control of compliance with the use of public resources in Mexico City.
